The Foundations of Formative Instructional Practices learning path includes valuable tips, resources, examples, videos and downloads that build educators' understanding of formative instructional practices and their importance in implementing the Common Core State Standards.

Course 1: Introducing Formative Instructional Practices

Two one-hour segments

- Understand what formative instructional practices are.
- Become familiar with key research findings related to the effects of formative instructional practices on student achievement.

Course 2: Creating Clear Learning Targets

Two one-hour segments

- Understand the benefits of clear learning targets.
- Know how to ensure learning targets are clear to the teacher.
- Know how to make learning targets clear to students.

Course 3: Collecting and Documenting Evidence of Student Learning

Two one-hour segments

- Know how to collect accurate formative evidence of student learning.
- . Know how to document formative evidence of student learning.

Course 4: Analyzing Data and Providing Effective Feedback

Two one-hour segments

- Know how to formatively use methods of assessment to analyze evidence of student learning.
- Understand what makes feedback effective.
- Know how to provide effective feedback.

Course 5: Involving Students: Peer Feedback, Self-Assessment and More

Three one-hour segments

- Know how to prepare students to give each other effective feedback.
- Know how to prepare students to self-assess with a focus on learning targets.
- Know how to prepare students to create specific and challenging goals.
- Know how to prepare students to track, reflect on and share their learning with others.

The Leading and Coaching Formative Instructional Practices learning path is a continuation of the Foundations of Formative Instructional Practices learning path. It is designed to help those with leadership or coaching responsibilities plan for change and promote a systemic approach to implementation of formative instructional practices.

Course 6: Leading Formative Instructional Practices

Three one-hour segments

- Know how to plan for change and promote a systemic approach to formative instructional practices.
- Understand the importance of a balanced assessment system and the pivotal role formative instructional practices play in it.
- Understand the conditions, structures and processes needed to sustain the use of formative instructional practices.
- Know how to lead a quality implementation of formative instructional practices in your school or district by modeling and supporting the practices you expect to permeate the entire school community.

Course 7: Coaching Formative Instructional Practices

Three one-hour segments

- Know how to plan for change and promote a systemic approach to formative instructional practices.
- Know how to leverage blended learning and professional learning teams.
- Understand how to sustain the implementation of formative instructional practices.
- . Know how to provide effective feedback to teachers as they learn about formative instructional practices.
- . Know how to employ resources and strategies that support the use of formative instructional practices.
