Field Study Options:

1. Select one of the keynote speakers, Dr. Tony Wagner (Day 1 - keynote speaker) or Dr. Elle Alison (Day 2 - keynote speaker) and further research their work—Tony Wagner on *The Global Achievement Gap* or Elle Alison on *Renewal Coaching*. Write a two-page paper reflecting on your readings and how your district, school or classroom is meeting this challenge. Please cite at least two references by the selected presenter.

Papers Due: July 13, 2010

- 2. List three new facts/concepts you learned at the conference and briefly explain each; choose two of these that you will share with a colleague; and, lastly, list the one you will actually implement. Write an Action Plan for this one and include your objective(s), two or three strategies you will use to achieve your objective, a timeline and an assessment (i.e. how you will know if/when your objective(s) has/have been met).
- 3. The conference is focused around six strands: Data and Decision-Making; Focused Goal-Setting; Instruction and Learning; Community Engagement; Resource Management; Board Development and Governance. Choose <u>one</u> of these strands and write a two-page paper based on information gained from the learning lab(s) you attended. Analyze your current district, classroom or school regarding the implementation of school improvement efforts. You might choose the strand in which you feel your district/school/classroom is the strongest, the strand needing the most improvement or the one you feel presents the most challenge.
