MAXIMUM ASPIRE AWARD \$10,300

The following awards are available to eligible departmentalized core foundation teachers assigned to one or more core foundation subjects—reading, math, language arts, science, or social studies in grades 3–8. Core foundation teachers in grades 3–8 whose cumulative gain indices are less than or equal to -2.0 across all core foundation subjects they teach will not be considered for any award in Strands I and III.

Departmentalized core foundation 3–8 teachers are grouped first by elementary or secondary HISD campuses, then by subject for comparison. Award Exceptions

- If staff are assigned to a campus where data are not available, their award will be determined through special analysis. If core foundation teachers in grades 3–8 teach too few students with data in a grade or subject to produce a value-added report, special analysis may be used to determine part of their award.
- In cases of special analysis, staff are eligible to receive up to 50 percent of the maximum award amount for Strand II.

* College Readiness Standard is TAKS Writing/ELA scale score of 2200 or greater AND writing composition score of 3 or better on either the TAKS Writing grade 4 or 7 or the 11th grade TAKS ELA.
