Unfortunately, many small-town and rural school districts are unable to provide their students with the rigorous, results-producing education they need to be college/careerready. These districts also struggle to recruit and retain the most important asset in increasing student achievement great teachers.

Responding to these and other regional challenges, Battelle for Kids and a collaborative of 21 Appalachian Ohio school districts have joined forces to create and implement a comprehensive model to transform rural education and student outcomes.

At the conclusion of this multi-year initiative, the ultimate goal is to implement a successful reform model that can be scaled across rural Ohio and the country.



Uniquely Positioned for Success

Despite the challenges facing Appalachian Ohio, this region has examples of high student achievement. Appalachian Ohio is united by its strong sense of community and culture. Acknowledging its strengths and areas for improvement, the Collaborative is uniquely positioned to transform leadership and produce significant student gains because of its:

- Unprecedented support. Capitalizing on the unique support among superintendents, union presidents, board of education presidents, and local and regional organizations.
- Economies of scale. Leveraging the size of the Collaborative to combine resources and access new resources and solutions.
- Collaborative networks. Cultivating the dynamic relationships between districts and education partners to sustain continuity and accountability.
- Existing academic strengths. Sharing information about existing academic successes and encouraging collaboration between districts and educators to accelerate and replicate best practices and generate new innovations.
- Alignment with federal and state education priorities. Building on innovative federal, state and local initiatives to improve teaching effectiveness, increase rigor, inform instructional practice, and more.





The Rural Transformation Model

The Collaborative's mission is to accelerate college/careerreadiness for every student. Uniting research-based and results-proven strategies for dramatically improving human capital development and accelerating student outcomes, the model addresses six components for transformational change: Increasing College/Career-Readiness, Enhancing Teacher Quality, Using Data to Inform Practice, Developing Leaders, Engaging the Community and Recognizing Excellence.

Connecting these components are four core processes: **collaboration**, **communication**, **technology** and **training**. As a result of implementing and integrating these components and processes, roles and responsibilities will change and a new culture for 21st century learning will be realized.

The Compelling Need

Rural Ohio value-added student projection data reveal that 70–80% of rural Ohio students have a 50% or less probability of achieving a college-ready ACT score.

The Results We Expect

The primary success measure will be the dramatic and sustained increase in the participating districts' college/career-technical school entrance rates and, ultimately, completion rates. Other measures of success for participating districts will include:

- 85% of students taking the ACT college entrance exam and 100% of those students scoring a minimum of 22.
- Increasing teacher value-added scores annually.
- Eliminating achievement gaps for economicallydisadvantaged students.
- 70% of students entering college and college completion rates rising.
- High school graduates entering college with a minimum of six credits from Advanced Placement (AP) and/or post-secondary education options (PSEO).

Ultimately, this work will be scaled across rural Ohio and the country.

The Collaborative will have national expertise available through consultation with the authors of "A Grand Bargain for Education Reform." While not a prescription, this book provides a useful guide for the Collaborative's efforts.
