Measuring Student Growth in the Arts for Ohio's K-12 Students

High-quality assessments are an integral part of measuring and monitoring student growth. Currently, there is a critical need for solid growth measures in the arts. And, as high-quality vendor assessments are not available, arts educators across Ohio are left to develop measures, often in isolation and without adequate assessment literacy.

To help fill that need, The Ohio Arts Assessment Collaborative (OAAC), a consortium of arts educators, created an innovative suite of authentic assessments to measure student growth for K–12 dance, drama/theatre, music, and visual arts. These new assessments are aligned with arts education standards in Ohio. The consortium will share with all Ohio educators the completed arts assessments, which will be field-tested for validity, reliability, and ease of implementation, as well as provide access to all professional learning resources developed to increase the assessment literacy of arts educators.



Accessing the OAAC Assessments

1. Visit the OAAC portal homepage at BattelleforKids.org/OhioArts.
2. Choose “Assessments” from the blue ribbon at the top of the page.
3. Select the Assessment you would like to view.
4. An account login page will open.



5. Current Users: If you already have an account (because you've used other Battelle for Kids online solutions), enter your user name (full school email address) and password, and click “Login.”
 - If you've forgotten your password, select the “Forgot Password?” link. You'll then be prompted to enter your email address and you'll receive an email with a link to reset your password.
6. New Users: Select “Create Account.”

First time users: An access code is required to create a new account. Obtain your district or school-specific access code from your principal or supervisor and click [Create Account](#)

Then, enter your school email address and the access code provided by your principal.

You will be asked to enter your name, a password, and your Educator State ID number, a series of two numbers followed by seven letters, found in the top left corner of your teaching license. 7. After a successful login, you will be able to view the assessment materials.

Locating Arts Assessments

From the Assessments page, you can view the full library of assessments for each subject area.

- *Note: You will be asked to login before you can view assessment and support materials. Please see the previous page for login instructions.*
- To begin a new search, select “Reset” to reset the filter.

Theatre (10)	1st Grade	1st Grade Drama/Theatre	1st Grade Theatre
Visual Arts (13)	1st Grade	1st Grade Visual Arts	Written assessment provides data on students' understanding of overlapping shapes, size of shapes, and use of line to convey depth; 40% selected response and 60% performance
