


A Making Meaning Guide for Understanding Your Multiple Measures Report Results

The Multiple Measures Report—Page 1 of 3


This page explains the overall intent of the report. It also contains basic information about your teaching status and your school.



<u>Above Average</u> is more than one standard deviation <u>above</u> the District's mean performance. <u>Average</u> is within one standard deviation of the District's mean performance. <u>Below Average</u> is more than one standard deviation <u>below</u> the District's mean performance.
